Vincent Baudriller

Former Co-Director of the Festival d'Avignon and current Director of the Théâtre de Vidy in Lausanne. Baudriller is searching for a theatre which is disconcerting and challenges our perception, 'a contemporary theatre for contemporary people'.

Milo Rau

Swiss theatre director, playwriter, journalist, essayist and scientist. Milo Rau was awarded the Swiss Theatre Award in 2014. He became well-known for his re-enactments of court trials.

knowbotiq (Yvonne Wilhelm, Christian Hübler)

knowbotiq is working on the interface of art, media and society and develops figurations and assemblages which question the balance of power, cross translocal geographies and enable forms of epistemic disobedience.

Phillip Van den Bossche

Art historian and curator of the 'Salon Suisse' program of 16 October. Phillip Van den Bossche is Director of Mu.ZEE – Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art, Ostend (Belgium).

Wanuri Kahiu

Wanuri Kahiu is a Kenyan film director. Afrofuturism is a recurring theme in her work and she has stated that African people and cultures have been engaged in Afrofuturistic thought for centuries. Wanuri Kahiu has received several awards and nominations for the films which she directed, including the awards for Best Director, Best Screenplay and Best Picture at the Africa Movie Academy Awards in 2009.

Nnedi Okorafor



Private guerilla negation (Tristan Tzara)

7 pm

Doors of the Palazzo Trevisan open to the public/bar

7.30 pm

Presentation by Vincent Baudriller on the utopian potential of the contemporary theatre beyond negation. Milo Rau will talk about his theatre-practice of re-enactments and it's cathartic potential. Can a No become a Yes? Followed by drinks and a panel discussion on 'Dada. scandals, law suits and the limits of art'. After the break the Switzerland-based artists of **knowbotiq** (Yvonne Wilhelm and Christian Hübler) will stage a performance entitled 'b(l)ack dadaism: kotomisi un-inform'. On the occasion of the 100 anniversary of Dada in 2016 knowbotiq are preparing in collaboration with DJ Fred Hystere a series of small and raw live sets of postdigital stagings.
